STATUS OF IMPLEMENTATION OF THE 2020 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

1.1 INTRODUCTION

The Annual Progress Report (APR) provides a summary of the true reflection on the status of implementation of the 2020 Annual Action Plan (AAP) and for that matter implementation of the Municipal Medium-Term Development Plan (MMTDP) for the planned period, January to December 2020. The report constitutes the third Annual Progress Report on the implementation of the 2018-2021 MMTDP under the current Medium-Term National Development Policy Framework-An Agenda for Jobs: Creating Prosperity and Equal Opportunity for All. It is been compiled from the Annual Progress Reports from the various decentralized departments and other agencies that were involved in the implementation of the 2020 Annual Action Plan. It seeks to outline the achievements made and challenges faced in implementing the AAP/MMTDP and the recommendations made to ensure higher successes in future implementation of the plan.

1.2 PURPOSE OF THE MONITORING AND EVALUATION (M&E) OF THE 2020 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN (AAP)

- i. To assess whether the projects are having the planned impacts in order to decide whether or not to replicate the model elsewhere.
- ii. To assess the programmes in terms of effectiveness, impact on the target group, efficiency and sustainability in order to improve its functioning.
- iii. Assess whether or not developmental goals, objectives and targets of the MTDP and for that matter the Annual Action Plan (AAP) for the year are being met.
- iv. Identify achievements, constraints and failures so that improvements can be made towards the MTDP and project designs to achieve better impacts.
- v. Provide information for effective co-ordination of the MTDP.
- vi. Provide Municipal Authorities, the Regional Co-ordinating Council, Government, Development Partners, community project management teams and the general public with better means of learning from past experience.
- vii. Improve service delivery and influence allocation of resources in the municipality and demonstrate results as part of accountability and transparency to the people and stakeholders within the municipality.
- viii. Reinforce ownership of the MTDP and build M&E capacity within the municipality.



1.4 CHALLENGES ENCOUNTERED IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE AAP/MMTDP

- Low IGF generation as a result of poor revenue database and response of citizens to payment of approved rates and fees.
- Shortfalls and untimely release of central government transfers
- Poor attitude to communal work which affected communal sprit for implementation of community initiated projects
- Inadequate logistics such as vehicles, furniture, computers and stationery to facilitate monitoring and general performance of the Municipal Assembly
- Poor public attitude to sanitation issues and management
- Over reliance and unsustainable exploitation of forest resources
- Non-functioning of the sub-structures to serve as a supporting to the Assembly in the execution of
 its mandates.
- Implementation of projects and programmes outside the approved Medium-Term Development Plan and the Composite Annual Action Plan which classified as contingency projects

- Low prioritization of monitoring and evaluation as well as other important MPCU mandatory activities due to resources and logistical constraints resulting from low priority given to such activities.
- Low capacity of key personnel (Heads of Departments and technical staff) in planning, monitoring and evaluation as well as reporting.
- Low IGF generation capacity to support implementation of MTDP and the Annual Action Plan
- Failure of communities to engage and involve the Assembly in the implementation of community self-help or demand driven projects especially the designing to meet the approved standard
- Failure of Decentralized Departments to submit their Quarterly and Annual Progress Reports on time to the MPCU Secretariat.

1.5 PROCESSES INVOLVED AND DIFFICULTIES ENCOUNTERED IN THE PREPARATION OF THE ANNUAL REVIEW REPORT

The 2020 Annual review report was prepared by the Municipal Planning Co-ordinating Unit (MPCU) with inputs from the decentralized departments and other development partners working within the Municipality. Monitoring and evaluation data were collected from both primary and secondary sources to assess the level of implementation of projects and programmes as contained in the 2020 Annual Action Plan.

1.5.1 Primary Data

Primary data were obtained through the quarterly field monitoring exercises carried out by the MPCU and other stakeholders on projects and programmes implemented in the municipality by the Municipal Assembly (MA), decentralized departments, Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) and other development partners.

1.5.2 Secondary Data

Secondary data was also collected for the preparation of the 2020 Quarterly and Annual Progress Reports from the following sources:

- Quarterly and annual progress reports from the decentralized Departments and other Sub-Vented Agencies.
- Quarterly monitoring exercise reports by the Regional Coordinating Council
- Reports from Development Partners, and Non-Governmental Organizations among others which were compiled constituted data from the secondary sources.

The Municipal Planning Coordinating Unit collated, analyzed and interpreted all data collected from key stakeholders during the review meetings for the enhancement of the APR preparation.

The successful preparation of this report was not without challenges. Some of the challenges encountered were:

- Inadequate logistical (vehicle for M&E) and financial support for effective M&E.
- Absence of M&E units/focal persons within some decentralized departments to readily provide M&E information.
- Untimely submission of progress reports from decentralized departments and other stakeholders to facilitate preparation of the APR.
- Inadequate disaggregation of municipal data.

The MMTDP was prepared under the five main Development Dimensions or Pillars of the Agenda for Jobs:

- Economic Development
- Social Development
- Environment, Infrastructure and Human Settlement
- Governance, Corruption and Public Accountability
- Ghana's Role in International Affairs

1.6.1 Summary of Achievements

Out of the 349 projects and programmes planned for the year, 65 representing 18.62% constituted physical projects whiles 284 representing 81.37% constituted programmes and supplies. Out of all the 349 physical projects and programmes, 338 representing 96.85% were implemented whilst 11 representing 3.15 could not be implemented.

Out of the 65 physical projects, 62 representing 95.38 % were implemented, completed on time. However, 3 representing 4.62% were not implemented.

Out of the 284 programmes planned for the year, 266 representing 93.66% were implemented while 8 representing 6.34% could not be implemented.

It is however important to note that the Municipal Assembly and its departments showed high level of commitment in the implementation of the AAP, as much as 96.85% of the projects and programmes outlined in the AAP were either completed or at various levels of completion by end of December, 2020.

CHAPTER TWO

MONITORING AND EVALUATION OF ACTIVITIES REPORT

Within the year, the Municipal Assembly through the MPCU monitored and reported on a number of projects and programmes that were implemented and being implemented.

Project/Programme Status for the Period October – December, 2020

This report covers the status of implementation of physical/development projects and programmes (propoor interventions) that were carried out within the Municipality as at 31st December, 2020. In terms of physical projects, a total number of One Hundred and Forty (140) projects were being planned for implementation and monitoring as detailed out in table 5 below.

2.1 Location of Projects


Out of the Seventy (72) projects being implemented, 18 of them representing 25 % are located in Goaso the Municipal Capital while the remaining 54 representing 75% are fairly spread across the municipality. The fairly spatial distribution of the projects and programmes arose out of the need to meet the needs of rural communities and reduce the rate of rural-urban migration in the municipality.

2.2 Sectorial Distribution of the Projects

From table 5 below, Education covered (33.33%) of the investment projects in the Municipality among sectors. On the other hand, Economic and Energy were the sectors with the least number of projects implemented. However, it is important to note that water and electrification were going on in a number of communities but were lumped together as one project as each was awarded as a single contract.

2. 3 UPDATE ON FUNDING AND DISBURSEMENT

2.3.1 Update on Funding/Revenue Sources


During the year under review, the MA mobilized and received funding from various sources to finance its programmes and projects. The funds as indicated in table 7 below only represent direct inflow to the MA and hence exclude direct central government inflows to the decentralized departments.

From the table 8 above, total revenue inflow into the Municipality for the year increased from **GH¢** 7,576,439.88 in 2018 to **GH¢** 8,807,988.68 in 2020 that is by 16.25%. Out of the total inflow, DACF constituted 20%, GOG Grants was 49%, IGF also constituted 14%, MP's Common Fund was 4%, PwD's share was also 2%, MSHARP constituted 0.05, LEAP worth of 0.0%, MAG also constituted 2% whilst Donor Fund (Development Partners thus DDF) formed 9% of the total revenue.

However, actual revenue of GH¢8,807,988.68 fell below the budgeted revenue of GH¢10,454,471.65 for 2020 by GH¢1,646,482.97 that is (15.75%). This undoubtedly negatively affected implementation of the MA's projects and programmes within the year, since resource inflows into the municipality for the year under review were generally discouraging.

2.3.2 Comments on Efforts to Generate Funds (IGF)

To improve local revenue generation, the MA took a number of measures including;

- 1. Rehabilitated a pickup for the monitoring of revenue collection.
- 2. Carried out periodic spot checks at revenue stations.
- 3. Constructed barriers at all entry points.
- 4. Periodic training of revenue collectors on effective revenue collection techniques.
- 5. The MA initiated processes to develop a more sophisticated database on revenue items
- 6. The MA formed revenue mobilization task force (IGF Technical Working Group) which improved revenue collection and management.
- 7. The MA also intensified supervision and monitoring of revenue collection and management.

2.3.3. Challenges with Regards to Generating Funds (IGF)

- 1. Inadequate data on revenue items in database for realistic budgeting.
- 2. High level of revenue leakages.
- 3. Weak functioning of Zonal Councils and Unit Committee.
- 4. Low level of Public Education of citizenry on payment of tax.
- 5. Weak institutional collaboration in revenue mobilization.
- 6. Low capacity of revenue collectors.
- 7. Inadequate resources and time required for larger and extensive stakeholder engagements towards preparation of fee-fixing resolution.
- 8. Inadequate logistics and motivation for revenue collectors as well as supervision and monitoring of revenue mobilization by task force (IGF Technical Working Group).

2.3.4 Update on Disbursement

The table below shows a corresponding update on disbursement of funds received by the MA within the year.



2.3.5 Comments on Adequacy of Funds

As indicated in table 10 above, resource inflows into the municipality for the year 2020 was generally not encouraging. Actual revenue of **GH¢8,807,988.68** fell below the budgeted revenue **GH¢10,454,471.65** for 2020 by **GH¢1,646,482.97** that is (15.75%). This negatively affected implementation of the MA's projects and programmes within the year. This is shown on the diagramme below;

2.3.6 Comments on Utilization of Funds in Accordance with the Budget

From the Table 10 above, it is clear that expenditure of GH¢9,254,817.04 which represents about 88.5% for the year was within the budgeted amount of the projected expenditure of GH¢10,454,471.65. But consequently, the Assembly's spent more than the generated revenue of GH¢ 8,807,988.68 by a difference of GH¢446,828.36. Although there is a sign of good expenditure budgeting, the Assembly spent above the revenue it generated by an amount of GH¢446,828.36.

There is a sign of good expenditure management by the Municipal Assembly as compared to the budgeted amount of the projected expenditure of GHC10,454,471.65, the Assembly spent almost the amount of revenue inflow into the Municipality.

2.3.7 Challenges with Regards to Disbursements of Funds

Despite the availability of an approved budget, often management was compelled to re-allocate the available funds to meet other competing and challenging demands that were not captured in the budget especially in the cases of election related security and disasters expenditure.

2.4 PERFORMANCE OF CORE MUNICIPAL DEVELOPMENT INDICATORS

2.5.1 The Ghana School Feeding Programme

Under the School Feeding Programme, the number of schools benefitting from the programme increased from 4 in 2010 to 16 in 2017 whilst additional 12 schools were added to benefit from the programme. Similarly, school enrolment increased from 1,453 in 2010 to 4,373 in 2012 and increased to 4,691 in 2013. Since 2013 however, enrolment on the programme in the 16 beneficiary schools has being declining. It registered a figure of 4,456 in 2014 which decreased to 4,343 in 2015, 3,836 in 2016 and then to 4,012 in 2017 and 7,935 in 2018. However, in 2020, the enrolment increased to 9,136 as indicated in (table 13) below.

However, **GH¢79,046.95** covering 3rd term trench of 2018/2019 academic year was also released and disbursed to the various public basic schools in the municipality. There is therefore an indication that, there is no outstanding arrears for the year under review.

During the year under review, an amount of GH¢95,303.30 was released and disbursed to the various schools as first trench for the 2020-2021 academic year.

The LEAP programme aims at providing unconditional cash transfers to support the extremely poor households. These are people who have no means of livelihood or limited productive capacity. The three category of beneficiaries of LEAP are Orphans and Vulnerable Children (OVCs), severely disabled people and people aged 65years and above but without productive assets.

The LEAP programme which was launched in the Municipality in May 2015 saw GH¢96,372.00 distributed to all the 186 households registered in the 16 beneficiary communities with 568 individual beneficiaries in 2018.

A total number of 28 additional communities were added to benefit from the LEAP programme with a total number of 468 household registered and a total number of 998 individual beneficiaries captured to benefit from the intervention. However, in 2020, payment was effected covering all the 28 additional communities that were hooked onto the programme as detailed out in the table above.

Support to People with Disability (PWD)

2.5.5.1 Distribution of People with Disability (PWD) Share of the DACF

Within the year, an amount of One Hundred and Fifty-One Thousand, Seven Hundred and Ninety-Nine Ghana Cedis and Fifty pesewas (GHC151,799.50) was released and disbursed to 74 persons with disabilities to meet their various needs. The details of the beneficiaries are outlined in the table below;

2.5.7 PARTICIPATORY MONITORING AND EVALUATION (M&E)

During the period under review, the following activities were undertaken:

- Quarterly stakeholders' review meetings on the implementation of the Municipal Medium Term Development plan were organized.
- The Municipal Planning Co-ordinating Unit (MPCU) held its quarterly meetings to review implementation of the 2020 Composite Annual Action Plan.
- The MPCU carried out four quarterly participatory monitoring with key stakeholders including Hon. Assembly Members, Chiefs, Opinion Leaders, user departments and contractors.
- A stakeholders' review meeting was organized to validate the 2020 Annual Progress Report.

To facilitate and promote Participatory Monitoring and Evaluation (PM&E), the MPCU vigorously involved key stakeholders and beneficiaries in the M&E. They were the Decentralized Departments, the Six Zonal Councils, NGOs (Care International, Ghana), all the three paramountcies in the Municipality and the Disable Society. The rest were Market Women Associations, Beauticians and Hairdressers Association, Tailors and Dressmaker Association. The MPCU actively partnered the aforementioned stakeholders in the monitoring and evaluating of the Municipal Annual Action Plan to promote transparency and accountability in project implementation.

1. PERD (Planting for Export and Rural Development)

- ❖ Distribution of 10,000 coconut seedlings to 1023 farmers in the municipality.
- Out of the 1023 farmers, 127 were females and 896 males.
- ❖ Field officers assigned to all beneficiary farmers ensured that, farmers who received the coconut seedlings planted them on their fields.
- Monitoring of planted coconut by MOFA director and MOs has been conducted in the municipality

2. PFJ (Planting for Food and Jobs) for the 2020 Cropping Season

i. Seed Rice Received in the Municipality

- ❖ 921 bags of seeds rice (AGRA), of weight 40kg per bag, were received by MOFA for the year 2020.
- ❖ It was sold to farmers at subsidized price of 3cedis per kilogram.
- ❖ A total number of 1,806 farmers purchased all seeds rice (out of which 1,204 were males and 602 were females).
- ❖ The seeds rice was cultivated on 2,113 hectares of field within the municipality.

ii. Seeds Maize Received in the Municipality

a. For the major season for the year 2020.

- ❖ 761 bags of seeds maize, of weight 45kg per bag, were received by MOFA and other input shops in the municipality, for the year 2020 major season.
- ❖ It was sold out to farmers at a subsidized price of 3cedis per kilogram.
- ❖ A total number of 3,980 farmers purchased all seeds maize (out of which 2,651 were males and 1,329 were females)

b. For the Minor Season for the year 2020.

- ❖ 415 bags of seeds maize, of weight 45kg per bag, were received by MOFA and other input shops in the municipality, for the year 2020 minor season.
- ❖ It was sold out to farmers at a subsidized price of 3cedis per kilogram.

- ❖ A total number of 1,302 farmers purchased all seeds maize (out of which 856 were males and 446 were females).
- ❖ The seeds maize received both major and minor season were cultivated on 2,092 hectares of field.

iii. Fertilizers Received in the Municipality for the 2020 Cropping Season

- ❖ A total of 12,311 bags of NPK and 8,203 bags of Urea (25kg per bag for NPK and urea respectively).
- ❖ Both NPK and urea were sold out to farmers at a subsidized price of, 42cedis and 40cedis per bag respectively.
- ❖ A total number of 1,732 farmers purchased NPK (out of which 1,155 were males and 577 were females).
- ❖ A total number of 1,012 farmers purchased urea (out of which 759 were males and 253 were females).
- Purchasing of fertilizers in the municipality was very high, because of i. the training provided to farmers on important of fertilizers by the extension officers.
- ❖ ii. The smaller size and subsidized price of fertilizers.
- ❖ And this has helped farmers to increase their yield in rice and maize.
- ❖ Farmers are able to produce 2.4 tons of maize per hectare, and 3.1 tons of rice per hectares.

iv. Vegetable Seeds Received in the Municipality for the 2020 Cropping Season

- ❖ Below are the vegetables and the quantity received in the municipality
- ❖ 200 sachets of onion, 87 sachets of chili pepper, 120 sachets of cabbage, 100 sachets of carrots, 30 sachets of lecttus and 45 sachets of cucumber

3. Distribution of Fall Army Worm (FAW) Chemicals to Affected Farmers

- The major pest infestation in the municipality is Fall Army Worm (FAW). The Fall Army Worm outbreak was spontaneous and destroys other crops in the absence of maize.
- ❖ All zones within the municipality were affected with the Fall Army worm menace which poses a major threat to the yield.
- ❖ The Department is however currently supplying chemicals to the farmers but sometimes due the shortage of the chemicals farmers will have to purchase the chemicals on their own. In the year 2020
- ❖ 879 hectares of maize field were invaded by the FAW pest.

- ❖ Because farmers have been trained on FAW by their officers, most of them notice and report to their officers at the initial stage of infection.
- ❖ And because of the availability of free chemicals to the affected farmers, 99% of the affected hectares fields were under perfect control, which is 870.21 hectares.
- ❖ Below is a table showing the name of chemical, quantity received, quantity distributed and number of farmers who received the chemical.

1. BRIEF BACKGROUND OF CORONAVIRUS/ COVID-19

COVID-19 is the disease caused by a new coronavirus, and Coronaviruses are a large family of viruses that cause respiratory infections. These range from the common cold to more serious diseases. It was first reported in December 2019 in Wuhan a city in China. The world health organization has therefore declared it a pandemic.

8. COMMISSION OF 3NO. CHPS COMPOUND AT BEDIAKO, AWEWOHO-MANHYIA AND MENSAHKROM TO ENHANCE ACESS TO HEALTH CARE

During the quarter under review, the Municipal Assembly commissioned and handed over 3No. CHPS Compounds that had been constructed at the various three communities to the Ghana Health Service to ensure the provision of health care service delivery to the people and also handle any cases with regard to COVID-19.

8. SAFETY MEASURES AT THE GOASO GOVERNMENT HOSPITAL

- In ensuring effective handling of emergency cases within the municipality, the Goaso Government Hospital has been designated as a treatment center whilst a newly constructed maternity block is now being used as the isolation center to help handle emergency cases regarding COVID-19 within the municipality.
- Screening of patients and clients to our health facilities is ongoing by triaging at the entrance of the facilities.
- Veronica buckets, hand washing facilities have been placed at the entrance of facilities
 and hand hygiene by washing of hands with soap under running water is undertaken by
 all entering the facility.
- Their temperatures are also checked.
- Monitoring and supervision of health facilities on COVID-19.

9. FUMIGATION EXERCISE

During the quarter under review, a fumigation exercise was carried out within the municipality to help control the spread of the virus. The exercise took place at public places especially market centers, churches, schools, police stations, lorry stations, refuse dumping sites, health facilities, abattoirs, and the major principal streets at Goaso, Mim, Akrodie, Fawohoyeden and Ayomso.

10. MOUNTING OF 3NO. BARRIERS AT ENTRY POINTS TO SCREEN AND TEST PASSENGERS ENTERING GOASO

In controlling the spread of the COVID-19 within the municipality, a 3No. Barriers were mounted at the various entry points to the Municipal capital, Goaso preferably the Goaso-Kumasi road, Goaso-Kukuom road and the Goaso-Mim roads and passengers are always screened and tested before entering Goaso.

13. OBSERVANCE OF SOCIAL DISTANCING IN MARKET PLACES WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY

Social distancing was seen as one of the effective measures in ensuring the control of the spread of the disease. And in ensuring this, the Municipal Assembly organized meeting with market women to rearrange the tables in the daily markets to reduce overcrowding at Goaso, Mim, Akrodie, Kasapin, Dominase, Bediako, Ayomso, Fawohoyeden and Asumura market centers. To this end, various parks and other satellite areas were identified and market women were relocated on different days to reduce overcrowding. Again, the Municipal Assembly collaborated with security agencies to enforce compliance with reducing number of passengers in public transport and Pragia motor cycles within the municipality.

14. SURVEILLANCE

- Trained 18 disease surveillance offices and community health nurses as contact tracers on Case Definition, contact tracing and screening tools
- Rumor investigation- ongoing
- Follow up on returnees from other countries with COVID- 19 with support from the immigration service
- Chemical Sellers sensitized on COVID-19 = 15
- Monitoring of People under self-Quarantine
- Daily review of medical records and updates on COVID-19 surveillance by facilities

15. CASE MANAGEMENT

- Pre –triaging at all health facilities ongoing
- IPC protocols strictly enforced in all health facilities
- All confirmed cases on admission treated and discharged at Goaso hospital

16. POST EASE OF RESTRICTIONS, ACTIVITIES FOR CHURCHES

- Monitoring to ensure that safety protocols are followed.
- Checking of temperature of all members
- Recording of names of church members that attend church at a particular time
- Hand washing equipment and sanitizers
- Social distancing about 2 meters apart

17. Monitoring of SHS

- To follow all the safety measures
- Checking of temperature of all students and teachers daily
- PPEs, face mask, hand washing equipment and sanitizers
- Social distancing 1-2 meters apart, in classrooms and dormitories
- Fumigation of Schools
- Isolation rooms and sick bay- only Ken Hammer has a functioning sickbay. MIm SHS has a sickbay but not functioning due to lack of beds, equipment and logistics, Ahafoman SHS has no sickbay

- Liaise with MCE to get Ahafoman SHS complete their sickbay, Mim SHS to make their sickbay functional by provision of basic equipment, beds and logistics.
- Advocate for more resources for covid-19 activities, i.e PPEs etc.
